Young Adult Youth Camp 2017



Hello once again from Paraguay!! April has been a busy month for the Mission 403 ministry, so let's get started with the news!! One of the biggest events this month was the first ever Young Adult Youth Camp (ages 21-35) held at the Campamento Tierra Prometida (Promiseland Camp) in Carapegua, Paraguay. Once again, Stephen and I were proud to team up with the Church of God of Prophecy National Music Team, directed by Carlos Duarte, to provide music during the entire camp. This year was the first time ever young people were divided into separate camps based on age groups. I believe this speaks to the testament of just how much the youth ministry in Paraguay has grown over the years. I've worked in several youth camps in the United States, and sometimes it's hard



Personally, I think splitting the camps to provide more accurate ministry for young adults is a good move on the part of the church here, and based upon my experience this year, I think this camp is going to increase in popularity in the future.

The theme for this year's Young Adult Youth Camp was Metanoia which means "a profound transformation." Ministry was focused on attitude and how we approach the world, turning back from unhealthy old habits. Classes and messages talked about how we need to change our way of thinking to reflect more of a Christ-centered nature and character. Several songs were specifically chosen to represent this theme during the worship services each night, with the track Dias Mejores (Better Days) by Benjamin Rivera as the main song. Usually, I'm one of the

main vocalists when it comes to playing different camps, but this time I was recruited to play the bass as the regular bassist was unable to attend.
