In July 2015, Stephen and I were so excited to receive news from the international offices of the Church of God of Prophecy (COGOP), that we were approved as missionaries for the country of Paraguay. Immediately, we started fundraising and speaking at several churches in the states of North Carolina, Georgia, and even New York. Our commitment period was two years, and when that time ended, we knew we must decide whether to continue working in Paraguay, or return to our lives and families in the U.S.

After much prayer, thought, and discussion, Stephen and I have decided that our time here in Paraguay has ended. On September 5, 2017, we will be flying from Asuncion to Miami, FL, and then we'll be driving the rest of the way to North Carolina. We're flying into Miami so that our dog Sampson will have to endure the least amount of time flying as possible. We believe the Lord is calling us home to NC, and we are excited to see what this next chapter in our lives has in store. We are sad to be leaving Paraguay. Over these past two years we've made many friends and memories that we will forever cherish. But, we are also proud of what we have accomplished during our time here. We have taught many different students about music. We've played at countless worship services and special events. It's been the adventure of a lifetime, and we're so thankful to God and to everyone whose made it possible for us to minister in this beautiful country.

After speaking with the international offices, donations for the Mission 403 ministry will be processed as follows. For the months of August and September, we will receive your contributions as normal. However, starting in October, any money received for our ministry will be redirected to the national offices for the Church of God of Prophecy here in Paraguay. This money will be used by national overseer, David Orozco, to benefit the many active churches throughout the country. If you have created an automatic debit account to give to our ministry monthly, please don't forget to log in and discontinue your giving after September. Stephen and I will continue to minister right up until the day we leave, and we need your continued support through September to keep up with our operating costs and to help provide for the moving expenses we will incur returning to our lives in North Carolina. Again, we want to thank each one of you reading this newsletter for all the support you've given us over the last two years. Thank you for your prayers, your monetary support, and for your encouragement. We love you and cannot wait to reconnect with many of you when we return home. Be blessed!

North Carolina Paraguay Mission Team





In July, we were blessed by a visit from some awesome people from the great state of North Carolina. Fourteen individuals from High Point, Lexington, and Greensboro braved the skies to travel all the way to the wilds of Paraguay! For the first week of their visit, the team spent most of their time working on two different building projects for some needy families near the campground. They built extra rooms for two single women, a mother, and her daughter, along with the daughter's children. The daughter only lived in a one-room house with a dirt floor, and had mattresses that she and her children used to sleep at night. This lady was very grateful to the team for providing the means to build an extra room for her and her children. She, along with her oldest son, were there everyday, helping to hand buckets of mortar to the brick layers so that they could work in the most efficient way possible. The older woman, the first lady's mother, lived only a few feet from the first worksite in a one-room house of her own. She'd moved away from her husband and sons due to abuse, and it was a blessing to the team to help the abuelita (little grandmother) have a better living space.

The NC mission team also paid a visit to Quyquyho, the village where Stephen and I live. Amanda Moore planned a fantastic children's program to





go along with the Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes we gave out to the community. We hosted the program at the new Quyquyho church building under construction beside my house. Many children came to the event and were excited to receive a gift along we the arts and crafts activities and snacks we provided.

After Quyquyho, the team then went to Argentina to visit the Iguazu Falls, one of the seven natural wonders of the world. We walked for hours around the Argentine side of the falls. Mariea (Bill) Shean, kept track of our journey with a pedometer to see just how far we walked. In total, walked over four miles and still

didn't get a chance to see everything. That night, we also visited the local church in Ciudad del Este (City of the East) and had a wonderful time fellowshipping with the local church members afterwards. Overall, this team was a great experience for everyone involved. This was the first mission trip experience for many of the team members and I think they'll be excited to participate in other ventures as they come along. For me and Stephen though, it was nice to spend time with people from "home". So, thank you to the team for coming to Paraguay, and thank you to everyone who made their trip possible!

According to Paraguayan etiquette, what is the proper way to approach someone's house?

In Paraguay, and for most of South America, it's rude to enter someone's property and knock on their door. Now I know many of you reading this will ask, "how do you go to someone's house if you can't knock on the door?" Well, in Paraguay, if you want to alert someone that you're at their house, you should approach the gate to their property and clap. Do not enter the property until someone gives you permission to proceed. Usually, the owner of the property will tell you "adelante", which means "come in". It took Stephen and I a while to associate a clapping noise to mean someone is at our house and wants to get our attention. So, boys

and girls, if you're ever in South America, you now know how to politely approach a house without offending anyone!
