Mission 403 is currently looking to buy instruments for instruction and for some of its students who cannot afford such a purchase on their own. Currently we are teaching lessons in guitar, piano and the electric bass. We hope to offer drum lessons sometime in the near future.

As of right now, we would like to buy the following instruments:

3-5 acoustic guitars- \$120 each

1 electric bass- \$500

- 1 keyboard (piano)- \$1000-\$1500
- 1 drum set (with cymbals)- \$600

piano, guitar, and the electric bass. We are hoping to also start offering drum lessons in the near future with the help of local drummer here in Paraguay, but we will have more details on those lessons at a later date. For now, we have about 15 students at the Campground Tierra Prometida and in the city of Carapegua. Soon, we will also be offering lessons in the village of Quyquyho and in the city of San Lorenzo which is close to the capital of Asuncion. God is blessing and we are beginning to see some of our students stand up and participate on worship teams during services. Our desire is to disciple and raise up talented musicians in our congregations so that we might make a joyful noise for all the nation of Paraguay to hear.



Youth Lock-In



Within the month of December, Mission 403 was asked to provide the music for a youth lock-in where all the COGOP churches of the southern region of Paraguay were invited to attend. So, we pulled together some of our students from the music school and some others who have been helping with worship at our local church and

However, now that we are somewhat established, Stephen and I have begun the process of building a small house in the village of Quyquyho. It will have two bedrooms, one bath, a living room, and a kitchen. Also, there will be a big front porch and a back porch to sit outside and enjoy everything quite village life has to offer. We are hoping to be living in our house by sometime in February God willing. Please pray that it doesn't rain too much more so that our construction workers can work on the house without having to stop due to the weather. We are very excited about our little house and are looking forward to when mission teams, friends, and family come to visit in the future.
